




Design Tech - Building Bridges Challenge

Year 10 all work really well and finished by product testing their designs by using them to cut pizza, (which they ate), before taking them home.




Creative Outcomes from Year 9 Art & Design Students







Travelling to school and college safely, now that LOCKDOWN has been eased.

It is likely that the roads and public transport system will be busier than when we returned to school in March, as more people have returned to work.

So please follow this advice:

- if you live a short distance from your school or college, walk or cycle to and from school wherever it is possible and safe to do so
- avoid sharing a car with anyone outside of your household or support bubble
- if you are using public transport to get to school or college, plan ahead and allow more time for your journey
- when you are travelling by public or dedicated school transport, don't forget to: wear a face covering (unless you are exempt)
- It is important you wear them for the entirety of your journey, including inside a bus or train station
- social distance where possible
- do not congregate in large groups anywhere on stations/ bus stops or in parks
- wash or sanitise your hands regularly
- be considerate to fellow passengers and staff.


